#### SPRINGFIELD HIGH SCHOOL HISTORY

The annexation of the Ellet district of Springfield Township to the City of Akron in April, 1929, forced some immediate changes in the school system. The loss of the Springfield High School building (currently known as the Ritzman Elementary School) required the Board of Education to purchase land and build a new high school building at the Sanitorium and Canton Road location. For two years, high school students attended school in the Sawyerwood School building.

F. A. Cady was the first (in fall of 1931) principal of this new building which has been known as the Central building of the Springfield School System. During the first year, the building was dedicated Dec. 4, 1931. Although the Class of 1932 (with 32 members), was the first class to graduate at the Central building, the Class of 1935 was the first group to receive their high school diplomas who had spent all four years of their high school experience at the Sanitorium Road and Canton Road location.

Verne H. Lynch became the second school principal of this new building and later became Superintendant of the school system. He retired in 1953 and went into the Real Estate business.

The Central building has interesting tile detail. Architectural decoration became less evident in the 1950 addition, 1976 vocational wing, and the 1979 natatorium.

The 1932 yearbook was called Red and Gray (named after the school colors): it maintained this name until 1940 when it became the Spartana. This name was used because the athletic teams are named the "Spartans" for the hardy people of ancient Sparta.

We, the members of the 1934, 1935, 1936 classes have a rich heritage. A personal study of the school memorabilia will be an interesting and rewarding experience.
